Peristyle and Cathedral of St. Domnius

The ancient Roman square Peristyle is located in front of the Cathedral of St. Domnius, the oldest cathedral in the world. Experience a taste of ancient times and enjoy unforgettable nights with romantic music outdoors. A true Mediterranean capital that takes your breath away. Here, you will experience both the ancient spirit and the vibe of a city in an entirely authentic way

At the very heart of Dalmatia, there is a city the story of which dates back a full 17 centuries, starting with the decision of Roman emperor Diocletian to build his palace on the peninsula next to Salona, a big Roman city. This decision became a cornerstone of one of the most influential cities on the coastline of the Adriatic Sea. Diocletian's Palace, the stone witness of the past, did not stay trapped in the past but became the core of a lively city, a pulsating hub that attracts the looks of everyone walking through its stone streets. The palace, presenting far more than just an archaeological monument, has been on the list of UNESCO'S World Heritage since 1979. It is a live history merged with new, contemporary times. If you walk through the streets of Split, you will step into a labyrinth of time, witnessing all the historical layers, from the ancient splendor of Peristyle to Renaissance portals and Baroque facades.

Discovering some of the oldest neighborhoods and streets, you uncover the Mediterranean way of life in its full sense. Its narrow cobblestone streets, houses with red roofs and green shutters, the yards of which are adorned with luxurious gardens, testify to the former way of life. Life here unfolds authentically. Color, liveliness and uniqueness are part of the strong southern identity that Split nurtures. However, Split is not just an openair museum, but a city that lives and breathes. The streets are filled with the scents of Dalmatian specialties, where each bite becomes a journey through culinary history. Over the years, Split has become a center of cultural events, hosting festivals, concerts and exhibitions that attract visitors worldwide.

The city does not sleep at night. Music echoes through the streets, while numerous clubs and bars open their doors to those seeking nightlife. The central place in Split, enriched with palm trees, cafés and restaurants, whether it is day or night – becomes the Riva.



Not far from the bustling Riva lies Poljud, a stadium built in 1979 for the Mediterranean Games, now home to the Croatian football club Hajduk. Split is immensely proud of its sporting achievements, with numerous Olympic and world champions emerging from its vibrant community. And when you need a break from the city bustle, beaches are inviting you to relax and enjoy under the sun, which shines on Split for more than 150 days a year, making it one of the sunniest cities in Europe.

Fans of the mega-popular TV show Game of Thrones will not be left behind in Split either, given that large parts were filmed in Split and the surrounding area. Follow the paths of GOT and discover impressive locations that have captivated a global audience. When talking about Split, it is impossible to overlook the famous Bačvice with its sandy shores where the most Split-specific sport – *picigin* – was born. This cultural heritage of the Republic of Croatia, due to its appeal, has spread along the entire Croatian coast, developing into specific local styles and variations. Explore the hidden coves around Marjan, which





offer a paradise for everyone to immerse themselves in the very essence of Split, a city that is not just a place, but a way of life.



Trogir



Every step taken among the stone houses and palaces of Trogir, which is also referred to as the museum city due to its centuries-old history, is a special experience

Sunbathing, swimming and outdoor activities are not the only attractions in Trogir. The destination is rich in cultural heritage, just waiting for you to discover it. Trogir is a cultural gem of Croatia, a city with a vast number of monuments and landmarks packed into a very small area. Many archaeological studies have shown that humans inhabited this area since prehistoric times. Additionally, remains of stone tools dating back at least 45,000 years have been found in Trogir. The uniqueness of the city stands out the most with sculptural art in stone, and because of that beauty and value UNESCO included Trogir's old city center on the World Heritage List.



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Walking throughout the streets of Trogir resembles traveling into the past, in the Greek, Roman and Venetian periods, as evidenced by one of the most beautiful examples of Greek art hidden in this city. Relief of the Greek god Kairos, the youngest son of Zeus, from the 3rd century BC, was found in the attic of the family Statilić (Statileo) house that brought many prominent people – diplomats, artists, world travelers.

The Kamerlengo Fortress

Visit city halls and the fortress which turns into the most beautiful concert stage and a venue for different events. The round fortress of St. Mark from the 15th century is also nearby.

Magnificent beaches near Trogir Discover the turquoise sea in wild coves and popular beaches near Trogir, which you can access by foot or bike through the pine forest, with a car or a boat.





The relief is today kept in the Church of St. Nicholas in Trogir. The Cathedral of St. Lawrence is also one of the most significant monuments, a building prominent with Romanesque and Baroque styles while containing valuable artworks. Trogir is a star of nautical tourism today. Trogir Promenade, or the dock, is the most popular spot from which mini-cruisers and luxurious yachts sail throughout Dalmatia, and visiting this location will convince you why.

The spirit of antiquity, Mediterranean lifestyle and excellent gastronomy guarantee an unforgettable and active vacation in Trogir. Shellfish, grilled fish, lobsters, octopus and seafood make a substrate of Trogir cuisine and through rich tradition, reveal rhapsody of flavors for your palate. With that, because of its micro-location, Trogir is an ideal starting point for one-day trips to local destinations, offering the chance to experience Dalmatia in its native state.

Island of Brač



Discover the largest Dalmatian island where culture, nature, gastronomy and stone masonry blend together

To best experience the long history and culture of the Island of Brač, visit Škrip, the oldest settlement on the island. Prehistoric walls, numerous archaeological finds, sarcophagi, reliefs and medieval tombs bear witness to the long history of this place and life on the Island of Brač. On the site of Illyrian walls dating back to around 1400 BC, a Roman mausoleum was erected, followed by the defensive fortress Radojković, which today houses the Museum of the Island of Brač with fascinating exhibits from Kopačina Cave, Roman gravestones, maritime maps and various handicrafts from Brač.

This jewel of cultural heritage on the Island of Brač is always a popular destination. Explore Pučišća, one of the most beautiful small towns in Europe,



Sutivan, a picturesque town which was once home to local nobility, with a Mediterranean atmosphere and stunning pebble beaches. You can also take a stroll through the stone streets and romantic squares of Supetar to experience the true spirit of a Dalmatian town. In the interior of Brač, just a kilometer from the sea lies the culturally rich settlement of Selca, which includes some of the

most beautiful beaches in Brač. Postira is also a must-visit, a small town for a great vacation where one of Croatia's greatest poets, Vladimir Nazor, was born. If you decide to visit Bol, a place once inhabited by winegrowers, fishermen and sailors, you will discover a destination with the most beautiful beach in the world. In Milna, you will find Baroque architecture and a haven for sailors and hedonists. Experience a true vacation on this charming island where the scented Dalmatian streets will enchant you, the beaches will impress you and the gastronomy will enrich your experience.

Here, the sea is turquoise, shade is provided by centuries-old pine trees and a symphony is performed by crickets. You will remember legends and stories about Brač for a lifetime, as well as the outdoor summer festivities when the entire island transforms into a cultural stage.

Island of Hvar




The sunniest island and Mediterranean capital of culture which became a mega destination

The Island of Hvar has been inhabited since ancient times. Archaeologists have found traces of life on the Island of Hvar that date back to 3500 years BC, and the special ancient culture was named Hvar culture (3500 – 2500 BC), according to the findings in Grapčeva and Markova Cave.

To this day, this picturesque area, ancient architecture, charming and fragrant alleys as well as colorful squares send out a Dalmatian vibe and leave every visitor breathless.

The entire island has an abundance of cultural heritage. Don't miss out on exploring fortresses, museums, churches, monasteries, but also one of the biggest attractions – the Fortress of Petar Hektorović. Today, Hvar commemorates more than 150 years of organized tourism and it



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is marked on the tourist world map as one of the most interesting destinations, which throughout the year attracts tourists from all over the world with a variety of contents. Dynamic and unique, Hvar is a luxurious island where the culture and lifestyle blend in close proximity, from gorgeous hills with scattered vineyards and stone walls to sunny beaches. The natural beauty of the environment is connected with charisma of the urban life and countless cultural and recreational activities along 270 kilometers of coastline.

Hvar was once a producer of lavender and lavender oil, and it is interesting that lavender, although it is a Mediterranean plant, arrived on the island in the twenties of the last century. The first lavender bush was planted in 1928, already by 1947 it covered around thirty hectares of the rocky soil, while in the '60s lavender was cultivated on 600 hectares of land and 20 tons of oil was obtained.

Island of Šolta



An island of wildness and unreal beauty with countless coves that true adventurers and gastronomes have yet to discover

Šolta belongs to the group of islands of Central Dalmatia. It is located between Brač to the east. Hvar to the southeast and the mainland to the northeast. The island is separated from the mainland by the Split Channel, from Brač by the Split Gates and from Drvenik Veli by the Šolta Channel. Inhabited since prehistoric times, it was first mentioned by Pseudo-Skylax in the 4th century BC under the name Olyntha and later it was known as Osolenta. With the arrival of the Croats, the name was Croatized to Sulet. The island carried that name until the modern era when, under Venetian rule, the Croatian name was Romanized to the form Šolta. However, the greatest role in the widespread use of the form Šolta was played by Austria-Hungary, which mapped the Adriatic region in the 19th century, using Italian toponyms. The first stories about Šolta are connected to the



Illyrians. According to legend, Queen Teuta had a fortress on the island's south side, above the Senjska Cove, and its remains are visible even today. From the crystal-clear sea, nautical adrenaline and adventurous exploration to leisurely enjoying the flavors of the Mediterranean. Discover the settlement of Stomorska on Šolta, which is the cradle of maritime heritage, a place with the longest maritime tradition that has produced generations of skilled sailors and shipowners. The maritime tradition has remained an inseparable part of the essence of Stomorska until present day.

The wild nature of Šolta and its impressive gastronomy perfectly capture the saying *the Mediterranean as it once was*. Don't forget to treat your palate with carob, the ancient Mediterranean delicacy that grows in the wild and after which the place Rogač on Šolta is named.



Explore the island by bicycle, explore places in the interior of the island and get to know the cultural diversity of the island and the archipelago, considered by many to be one of the most beautiful in Dalmatia.

The island has more than a hundred coves and beaches. Some are modern, equipped with showers, lounges and entertainment content, while most of them resemble a tranquil oasis of peace, perfect for a Mediterranean dream vacation for the whole family.

Island of Vis



A mystical island of impressive beauty and history preserves the authentic Mediterranean and nurtures the Dalmatian way of life

The islands surrounding Vis have been declared a UNESCO geopark due to their exceptional natural and geological heritage. If you wish to explore one of the last natural oases of the Mediterranean, visit the islands of Brusnik, Jabuka, Palagruža, Svetac and Biševo by boat. The Island of Vis hides a fascinating military past that you can explore through a labyrinth of intriguing tunnels stretching across the entire island. Due to its good geographical position, Vis was a perfect military refuge because it could be easily defended in case of an attack. Because of this, it was the only unoccupied island during World War II. After the war, the island officially became part of Yugoslavia, which Tito used to transform the island into the central naval base of Yugoslavia.



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Head to the very center of the island and visit the mysterious Vela Glava, a former military barracks and the island's former command center. Climb up to the cannon fortifications at Cape Stupišće, then walk through the sea tunnel in Parja Cove or explore the breathtaking locations on Vis that delighted stars like Meryl Streep, Colin Firth, Pierce Brosnan and the entire film crew during the filming of the popular sequel to the Hollywood hit

Vela Glava

Head to the very center of the island and visit the mysterious Vela Glava, a former barracks and the island's command center.

It is located on the northern side of the Island of Vis and is rich in archaeological findings from the Neolithic and the early Bronze Age.

Get to know the largest Dalmatian island, where culture, nature, gastronomy and stonework meet AFTERNOON: Sailing to the desired bay or place on Brač (1-2 hours, 5-10 nautical miles). Visit Bol and the famous Zlatni rat beach

DAY 2

Brač — Hvar MORNING: Sailing to Hvar (approximately 2 hours, 10 nautical miles) the sunniest island and the Mediterranean cultural capital that has become a mega destination AFTERNOON: Explore Hvar, visit the fortress and enjoy Hvar's nightlife.

DAY 3

Hvar — Vis

MORNING: Sail to Vis (approx. 3-4 hours, 15-20 nautical miles), a mystical island of impressive beauty and history that preserves the original Mediterranean and nurtures the Dalmatian way of life.

For return, distance from Vis to Split is around 30 nautical miles, or 4 to 8 hours of sailing depending on weather conditions.

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DAY 4

Vis — Komiža MORNING: Sailing to Komiža (approximately 1-2 hours, 5-10 nautical miles), a town on the island of Vis that is rightly called a small paradise on earth. AFTERNOON: Explore Komiža, visit the Blue Cave on Biševo.

DAY 5

Komiža — Šolta моглилд: Sailing to Rogač on Šolta

(approximately 4-5 hours, 20-25 nautical miles), an island of wild and unreal beauty with countless bays loved by true adventurers and discovered by gourmets. AFTERNOON: Visit Rogač na Šolta and relax completely.

For return, distance from Šolta to Split is 10-15 nautical miles, or 2 to 4 hours of sailing depending on weather conditions.







***** USEFUL INFORMATION FOR SAILORS

The commander of a vessel entering the Republic of Croatia by sea is required to pay the prescribed fees for navigation safety and marine pollution protection, pay the tourist tax, and register the stay of foreign nationals on board (if they are actually staying on the vessel) in accordance with special regulations. It is important to distinguish between arrivals from Schengen area countries and other countries.

Persons on a vessel for sport and recreation coming from or departing to a port in a Schengen area member state are not subject to border control and may enter a port that is not a border crossing point.

A vessel coming from a third country is required to enter exclusively into a port where an international border crossing point for passenger traffic in maritime transport is open. In exceptional cases, a vessel for sport and recreation may enter a port that is not a border crossing point. This exception is limited to exceptional circumstances, including force majeure, for example, extreme weather conditions, urgent medical issues, engine failure, or other technical problems, involvement in SAR operations.

If it concerns a re-registration, it is also possible to obtain and pay it via the link enautika. pomorstvo.hr. The fee amount depends on the length of the vessel and engine power, and it is paid for the calendar year regardless of the sailing period in the territorial sea and internal waters of the Republic of Croatia.

Ports open for international traffic in the Republic of Croatia are: Umag, Poreč, Rovinj, Pula, Raša-Bršica, Rijeka, Mali Lošinj, Zadar, Šibenik, Split, Korčula, Vela Luka, Ubli (Lastovo), Ploče, Metković and Dubrovnik. Seasonally (from April 1st to October 31st), these ports are also open for international traffic: ACI marina Umag, Novigrad (Istria), Sali, Božava, Primošten-Kremik, Stari Grad (island of Hvar), Hvar (port), Vis (port), Komiža, Cavtat.

FEE FOR NAVIGATION SAFETY AND MARINE POLLUTION PROTECTION

The fee is paid for the calendar year, regardless of the sailing period in the Republic of Croatia. A Payment Certificate is issued as proof of payment upon registration of the yacht or boat. The fee amount depends on the length of the vessel and the total power of propulsion devices.

AUTHORIZATION FOR VESSEL USERS

On a vessel owned by a natural person or persons, which is sailing in the Republic of Croatia, the vessel owner, members of their immediate family, and persons who have written authorization from the vessel owner may be present on board during navigation. The owner's signature on the written authorization must be certified by a domestic or foreign competent authority.

On a vessel owned by a legal entity, which is sailing in the Republic of Croatia, persons authorized to use the vessel based on a written power of attorney may be present on board during navigation. The text of the power of attorney must clearly state the name and surname of the responsible person in the legal entity who signed and stamped the power of attorney, the period of use of the vessel to which the power of attorney relates, the name and surname of the person responsible for managing the vessel if the vessel does not have a permanently employed crew, and the names of all persons who will stay on the vessel during the validity period of the power of attorney.

DOCUMENTS ON BOARD

On a vessel sailing in the Republic of Croatia, the following original documents must be available for verification purposes:

- Proof that all fees have been paid
- Proof that the vessel is seaworthy
- Proof that the person commanding the vessel is qualified to operate the vessel in accordance with the national regulations of the flag state or the regulations of the Republic of Croatia
- Proof of liability insurance for damage caused to third parties
- Proof of ownership or authorization for the use of the vessel.

LICENSES FOR OPERATING BOATS AND YACHTS

To operate boats and command yachts, a person must be qualified in accordance with the regulations of the country whose flag the boat or yacht flies, and if no qualifications are required in the home country for boat operation, then Croatian regulations apply. A person operating a boat or commanding a yacht of Croatian nationality, depending on the category of the boat and/or yacht, must possess a Certificate of Competence for Boat Operator or a Certificate of Competence for Yacht Commander or a license/permit for operating boats and yachts issued by the competent authorities of foreign states and recognized by the Ministry of the Sea, Transport, and Infrastructure. The list of recognized foreign certificates/licenses is published on the website of the Ministry of the Sea, Transport, and Infrastructure.

🗱 VIGNETTA

The vignette is a mark that proves the registration of arrival, the fulfillment of the conditions for sailing in the Republic of Croatia and the payment of the fee for navigation safety, light duty, maritime information map and administrative fee. The vignette is valid from the date of issue until the end of the current year. Vessels with a length of 3 meters or more must have a vignette, as well as vessels with a length of less than 3 meters and the total power of the propulsion machinery 5 kW or more. Rowing vessels do not have to have a vignette, regardless of their length. The harbor master's office or branch office issues a vignette based on the documentation that the master of the vessel is required to attach:

- List of crew and passengers
- · Evidence that the vessel is seaworthy
- Evidence that the person in command of the vessel is capable of operating the vessel
- Evidence of insurance
- Evidence of vessel ownership or power of attorney

🍀 TOURIST TAX

The tourist tax for vessel owners or vessel users is paid exclusively online through the portal nautika.evisitor.hr. The portal is available in Croatian, English, German and Italian and supports payments via all the world's most famous card brands. Sailors can pay the tourist tax according to the length of the boat or according to the number of people, that is, the number of nights if it is more favorable for them, which is usually the case during a shorter stay in the destination. Before leaving Croatian territorial waters, the captain of the vessel must pass border control at one of the ports of entry for international traffic in the Republic of Croatia and verify the Crew list and the Guest list.

The Nautical Information Service (nIS) application is intended for yacht captains, vessel managers, fishermen, divers, bathers and other people who spend time along the coast and at sea. The application was created in a multilingual version in Croatian, Slovenian, English, German, Italian, French, Czech, Slovak, Polish, Hungarian, Spanish and Russian.
